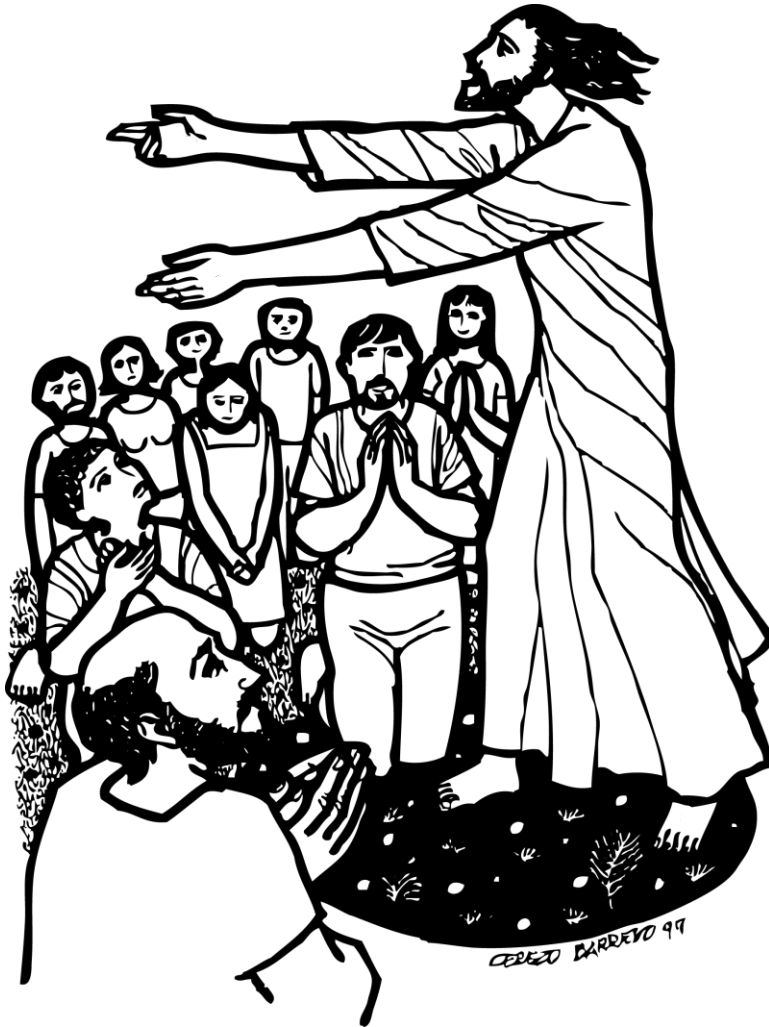

Pastoral Care and Guests at the Lord's Supper

We are concerned about the spiritual welfare of all who partake of the Lord's Supper. If anyone eats and drinks our Lord's Body and Blood unworthily (that is, not believing what this meal is and the benefits it gives), they eat and drink to their great spiritual harm. Therefore, we kindly ask that any who are not yet instructed, are in doubt, or who hold to a belief different from that of this congregation and the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod (LCMS) would not commune today.

Those who confess oneness in doctrine with us and are members of this congregation or a sister congregation of the LCMS are welcome to commune. If you are communing, an usher will invite you from your pew to approach the rail. Pastor will then welcome you to the Lord's Table and you can either kneel or continue standing. You will be offered a cup that holds the Body of Christ. Take the cup and consume the Lord's Body. An elder will follow to pour the Lord's Blood into that same cup. If you are not communing but would like to receive a blessing, please come forward and cross your arms at the rail. If you have any questions, please speak with Pastor or an elder before the service. Thank you!

Sermon Summary

Throwaway culture is prevalent! It's often cheaper to buy new than get the broken stuff fixed! Sadly, it's easy for humanity to bring such a throwaway culture mentality into our relationships! ***"You looked at me funny so I'm not going to talk to you!" "You have too many problems which makes you such an inconvenience so I'm just staying away!" "You're just too demanding for me, and I don't want to work this hard at a friendship! Bye!"*** Human love is often so limited and limiting! Human love leads to a smaller and smaller world as bridges are burned, toes are stepped on, or patience wears thin! Human love so easily deems people "unlovable", and they become throwaway people!

Jesus invites us into His love that expands and enlarges our hearts and worlds! ***"As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Abide in my love."*** [John 15:9] ***"Abide in my love!"*** In other words, our Lord is inviting us to make our Home in His love which is unlimited and unconditional! There's so much love that there's no room for a throwaway culture! No such thing as throwaway people! After all, He's the One who made Himself the greatest throwaway person so His love can be thrown open to everyone! Let's dwell in the Gospel Reading so that we make our Home in His love which produces fruitful lives of love directed at the very ones that this world so easily throws away!

First Reading

Acts 10:34–48

Peter opened his mouth and said: "Truly I understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. As for the word that he sent to Israel, preaching good news of peace through Jesus Christ (he is Lord of all), you yourselves know what happened throughout all Judea, beginning from Galilee after the baptism that John proclaimed: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power. He went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. And we are witnesses of all that he did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree, but God raised him on the third day and made him to appear, not to all the people but to us who had been chosen by God as witnesses, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. And he commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one appointed by God to be judge of the living and the dead. To him all the prophets bear witness that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

While Peter was still saying these things, the Holy Spirit fell on all who heard the word. And the believers from among the circumcised who had come with Peter were amazed, because the gift of the Holy Spirit was poured out even on the Gentiles. For they were hearing them speaking in tongues and extolling God. Then Peter declared, "Can anyone withhold water for baptizing these people, who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?" And he commanded them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they asked him to remain for some days.
